Addressing the opioid epidemic takes a team-based approach. INDIVIOR WAS BUILT TO DO JUST THAT.

Opioid use significantly increases a person's chances of involvement with the criminal justice system. Based on a 2025 report, of the estimated 2 million individuals in jails or prisons in the US between 2019 and 2025, 1 in 5 were incarcerated for drug-related offenses,2 Certain medications for opioid use disorder (MOUD) are associated with improvements in reducing criminal activity, decreasing drug cravings, and lowering illicit opioid use.
